Recruitment to the posts of Odisha Judicial Service, 2022

Plan of Examination of Civil Judge

The selection of candidates for recruitment to the cadre of Civil Judges shall be made through competitive examination, which shall consist of three parts as below:

- (1) Preliminary Written Examination,
- (2) Main Written Examination,
- (3) Interview.

SYLLABUS/SCHEME

A. Preliminary Written Examination:-

The preliminary written examination shall be of one paper carrying 100 marks with duration of one and half hours of examination with objective type questions of multiple choice (**i.e. 100 questions of one mark with negative marks of 25% for every wrong answer allotted to that particular question**) on the following subjects and the OMR answer sheets will be scrutinized by computer.

1. Constitution of India
2. Code of Civil Procedure
3. Code of Criminal Procedure
4. Evidence Act
5. Indian Penal Code
6. Limitation Act
7. Transfer of Property Act
8. Contract Act
9. Law of Succession (Indian Succession Act and Hindu Succession Act)
10. Specific Relief Act
11. The protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 and any other relevant law, as High Court may specify from time to time.

Note: The Commission shall call the eligible candidates for Main Written Examination, who have secured not less than 35 % of marks in case of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates and 40% in case of others in the Preliminary Written Examination.

B. Main Written Examination

The main written examination shall be on the following two compulsory papers and three optional papers. Each of the compulsory subjects shall carry 150 marks with a duration of 2 ½ (Two and

Half) hours of examination and each of the optional subjects carry 150 marks with a duration of three hours.

(1) Compulsory Papers

PAPER – 1

General English

- a. Translation and retranslation of ten lines each
- b) A short essay of about 150 words
- c) Precise writing consisting of 300 words
- d) 1 passage of about 500 words and 5 questions

Note: For “Translation and retranslation of ten lines each”, there will be 2 passages, i.e. one in English to be translated into Odia and another in Odia to be translated into English.

PAPER – 2

Procedural Laws-

- a) The Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973
- b) The Code of Civil Procedure, 1908
- c) The Indian Evidence Act, 1872

(2) Optional Papers

A candidate may choose any of the **three subjects** among the following:

Note:

A candidate shall answer the papers in English unless otherwise directed.

The standard of papers shall be that of LLB course and in respect of compulsory Paper-I, it shall be of a degree course.

C. Interview

Interview shall carry 100 marks. Questions to be asked in the interview may not ordinarily be outside the syllabus prescribed for the Main Written Examination. In the interview, questions covering broad national and international issues and matters of common interest in the field of Arts and Science may also be asked.

Provided that the name of the candidate shall not be included in the merit list unless such candidate secures a minimum 40% of marks in the interview.
